Reaching up to my shoulder, I was able to snag one rear foot with a length of plastic baler twine. With the help of a neighbor, Bob, I was able to push the calf forward between contractions while pulling on the twine, resulting in one rear foot presenting itself. The second foot was just past my fingertips and thus out of reach. We decided to pull the calf the way it was currently situated for fear of losing the calf while making further
