ON THE FARM...*The long delayed harvest has been completed and equipment is being stored for the winter. The last few calves are being born. The warm November weather provided comfortable conditions for outdoor calving. Eight calves were born during the month, the most recent, the morning after Thanksgiving. The air temperature that morning was 25° F, but the new mother took care of her new arrival and had cleaned him off well. We got him inside, milked his mother and fed the newborn half a gallon of warm colostrum. We are taking measure of the feed supply on hand. Both the hay and corn silage crops were smaller than expected, the hay due to the dry summer and the silage due to the wet fall. Though not enough to meet all our cattle forage needs, we are thankful for what was harvested.*



Evening chores must be finished before any of the celebration at home can begin. I stand amazed each Christmas Eve at how quickly all the animals can be fed, cared for and milked when we have a crew of kids who are very motivated.

After chores are done, we sit down and enjoy a delicious meal Sharlene has prepared while the rest of us were in the barn. No gifts can be opened until supper is finished, so I enjoy needling the kids a bit by having an extra piece of

pie or another helping of the main dish. I enjoy watching them get antsy, though I don't think they think it's very funny.
